## **ORDER**

(Delivered on 28-01-2025)

Read application filed by the appellant/applicant, perused the say given on behalf of the respondent/opponent. Heard both the sides at length.

It is contended on behalf of the applicant that, the order under appeal came to be passed on 30.08.2019, the copy of that order was received by post in September 2019, the said postal order is not traceable. The prescribed period of limitation for appeal is 60 days, which expired on 30.10.2019 and the appeal has been filed on 13.11.2019 as such there is delay in filing the appeal therefore prayed for condonation of delay.

After considering the oral submissions advanced on behalf of the parties it reveals that, even though the appeal has not been filed within prescribed period of limitation i.e., 60 days, it is certainly filed within the extended period of limitation i.e., 120 days therefore considering the reason and the period of delay, the applicant is certainly entitled for condonation of delay in filing the appeal.

In the result the application is allowed. The delay in filing the appeal is condoned.
