**ORDER**

**(Delivered on 03-12-2024)**

M/s. Riddhi Corporate Services Pvt. Ltd. / applicant has challenged the legality of order dated 25.04.2024, passed u/s. 7-A of the EPF & MP Act 1952, (for short, 'the EPF Act') and by this application, the applicant is requesting for condonation of precautionary delay in filing the appeal.

According to the applicant, he received the order under appeal dated 25.04.2024 on 03.05.2024 and the present appeal has been filed on 25.06.2024. This fact has not been denied by the opponent in the reply, which was filed on record and considering the date of receipt of order, I do not think that, there is any delay in filing an appeal, however if the date of issue of order is considered i.e., 25.04.2024, and the appeal has been filed on 25.06.2024, then there is delay of 61 days only.

As per the EPF Act, the appeal has to be filed within prescribed period of limitation i.e., 61 days from the date of appeal and considering the period of delay in the present

matter, there seems to be delay of only 01 day in filing an appeal therefore, the applicant is certainly entitled for condonation of delay in filing an appeal.

In the result, the application is allowed. The delay in filing the appeal is condoned.
