Perused the Memo of Appeal with enclosure filed by Mr. Angad Singh Bhusri, Senior Executive, Timpack Private Limited, Barnihat, Meghalaya Under Section 7-I of the Employees Provident Fund and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952, against impugned order No./NE/SHG/2139/000/ENF 501/Damages/44 dated 09-04-2025 passed by the R.P.F.C.-II, Regional Office, Shillong praying for setting. aside the impugned order dated 09-04-2025. As per Rule 4 of the Tribunal (Procedure) Rules, 1997 Memo of Appeal has been presented in triplicate on 17-06-2025 along with a Bank Draft No.789598 dated 11-06-2025 of ₹ 2,000/- in favour of the Registrar, CGIT. It appears that Rule 7 (1) of EPF Appeal Tribunal (Procedure) Rules 1997 has been complied.


Seen the scrutiny report submitted by the Registrar and perused the record. Considered. It appears to me that the Appeal has been preferred against the order dated 09-04-2025 passed by the Regional Provident Fund Commissioner-II, Regional office, Shillong under section 14-B of the Employees Provident Fund and Misc. Provision Act, 1952, whereby the Appellant was directed to pay Provident Fund dues of ₹ 64,352/- for belated remittances of contributions and administrative charges for the period from March, 2020 to June, 2022.

Heard learned Counsel for the Appellant. Learned Counsel prayed for admitting the Appeal and revoke as well as stay on recovery of the assessed dues in the impugned order passed by the Regional Provident Fund Commissioner-II, Shillong. Appellant has stated that the impugned order was received by the Appellant on 21-04-2025. The Appeal has been filed within 60 days from the date of order, which is well within the time prescribed under Rule 7 (2) of the Tribunal Rules.

The learned Counsel for the Appellant also prayed for stay the operation of impugned order dated 09-04-2025 till the final disposal of the Appeal and also prayed for passing necessary order restraining the Respondent from taking any coercive action against the Appellant during pendency of the Appeal.

Considered the submission and materials on record. The Appeal has been filed within time. Appeal is admitted. Issue notice to the Respondent along with copy of Memo of Appeal. In the meantime, no coercive action shall be taken by the Respondent against the Appellant.
