	The preliminary issue, framed vide order dated 29/07/2022 is as follows: -		
	Whether the enquiry conducted against the workman is legal and proper?		
	Facts connected in brief are the departmental enquiry has been conducted against rules and procedure he was not given sufficient opportunity to defence his case. No principle of natural justice is followed in the enquiry.		
	According to management, the workman was issued the charge sheet dated 22/03/2013 with an allegation that while being posted at the Manawar Branch and Ganpur Branch within the period 15/06/2009 to 17/06/2011 in Ganpur Branch and 18/06/2011 to 27/12/2011 he misappropriated Rs 3.84 lakhs from the accounts of various account holders. After finding his reply to the charge sheet unsatisfactory the department decided to conduct a departmental enquiry the enquiry was conducted as per rules and principle of natural justice, given full opportunity to the workman to defend his case. The Enquiry Officer submitted his report on 30/07/2024 holding all the charges proved. Agreeing with the findings in the enquiry, the disciplinary authority issued show cause notice to the workman with the copy of enquiry report and after considering the reply of the workman, punishment of removal of the workman from the service of the management bank was passed by the disciplinary authority on 19/09/2014. Also recovery of the amount of 3.84 lakhs, suffered by the bank was directed to be realized from gratuity. Appeal against this order was also dismissed by the appellate authority.		
	In evidence, the workman filed his affidavit but never turned up for cross examination. He also filed certified copy of judgement in ST No. 184/2013 and 177/2013. Management filed affidavit of its witness Dinesh Mahajan was not cross examined by the workman the management also proved the enquiry documents exhibit M1 to M7 which are to show cause the charge sheet,		

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	show cause on enquiry report, reply of show cause on		
	sentence order of punishment, and order of appellate		
	authority.		
	I have heard arguments of both the side of preliminary		
	issue and I have gone through the record. Perusal of		
	record shows that there were as many as 14 charges		
	regarding misappropriation of different amounts with		
	respect to different account holders in which entry of		
	deposit was mentioned in the passbook of the account		
	holders but the money was not deposited with the bank		
	nor was any deposit entry was made in the bank records.		
	As regards the enquiry proceedings, it comes out that the		
	workman participated in the enquiry and he was given		
	full opportunity to defend himself regarding the		
	punishment, the workman was issued the show cause		
	notice and it was after his reply, that the punishment		
	order was passed. Hence procedurally there is not defect		
	in the enquiry and punishment.		
	One point has been raised from the side of the workman		
	that the officer superior to the competent authority has		
	issued the charge sheet but this alone cannot be a ground		
	to vitiate the enquiry in absent of any prejudice		
	established against the workman. On the basis of the		
	above discussion the departmental enquiry is held legal		
	and proper preliminary issue No. 1 is answered		
	accordingly: - सत्यमेव जयते		
	Following additional issues are framed –		
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	1 Whather the charges are proved on the basis of		
	1. Whether the charges are proved on the basis of		
	enquiry.		
	2. Whether the punishment is proportionate to the		
	charges proved.
